
A one-stop knowledge shop to address development challenges in Africa


Making sense of complex issues, identifying trends and shaping the future is challenging!

This knowledge exists but is fragmented and hardly accessible.


What if it was all in one place?

You want to know where are the last undisturbed tropical moist forests in West Africa, and whether they are protected?


The platform gives you access to a collection of datasets on more than 30 interconnected topics, from continent to country level.

Maybe you're looking for information about electricity access in rural Senegal? And where best to invest in renewable energy?


Interactive tools allow users to explore selected topics in a tailored and detailed way.

Can we monitor gold mining in the Republic of Congo using satellite imagery? Do you know about the impacts of COVID-19 on money flows to Africa?


Stories are here to illustrate how scientific research supports political decisions and raises awareness about important issues.
